

Items of Interest:

Weather Transition - by Dick Stephens



Spring is not far off. This is a beautiful time of year as well as a very dangerous season for pilots. As we make the transition from cold wintery blasts to the rapidly changing patterns of spring weather, shifting jet streams, and pop up thunderstorms, we need to keep a "Weather Eye" out and understand what can happen.

Twenty seven % of all aircraft accidents are weather related and 90% of those are pilot related. Thirty per cent of weather related aircraft accidents are fatal. We all need to stay updated on our weather knowledge. I find it helpful to get information from several sources. I watch two TV weather broadcasts every day to stay current on the "Big Picture" of national as well as local weather. My favorite is Steve McCauley on channel 8. I also use "aviationweather.gov" because they have number of products to help understand what is happening. DUATS or DUAT is another good source for weather briefing.

If things seem a bit confusing I call FSS and talk to a weather briefer to help me interpret the data and make sure I haven't missed something. I encourage everyone to go to faasafety.gov click on "hot topics" then "Videos on Demand" for a number of very good refresher videos. There are 2 there on weather that are very informative. The site has a total of 6 video topics for safety training. They are Weather, Aeronautical Decision Making (ADM), Loss of Control, Controlled Flight into Terrain, Survivability, and Runway Incursion. If you are an AOPA member, go to their web site and take an interactive course on thunderstorms. Take the quiz and get wings credit. It is an excellent program. Remember weather really changes quickly in the spring.


EAA Chapter 1246 Annual Fish Fry - April 23, 2011

Garmin Says New GMA 350 Audio Panel Makes Flying Easy

Features Include Voice Recognition, 3D Sound, Advanced Auto Squelch Garmin has rolled out its new GMA 350 and GMA 350H audio panels. Designed for fixed wing and rotorcraft, respectively, the GMA 350 and 350H have industry-first features like voice recognition, 3D spatial audio processing, advanced auto squelch, and ambient noise based volume adjustment.

Video: Bell 407AH Helicopter Unveiled

Bell Helicopters bypassed the usual military procurement procedure and adapted a 407 for "law enforcement and paramilitary" use. With a 3,000-round-per-minute machine gun, a rocket launcher and FLIR, it's a potent adaptation of a proven airframe that's already attracting attention.

Big Rotary UAV Planned

The U.S. Marine Corps has approved development of an "unmanned aerial truck" that is an adaptation of the Kaman Helicopters' K-MAX heavy-lift helicopter. The K-MAX has interlocking twin rotors that eliminate the need for a tail rotor and give the aircraft impressive lifting ability. In its UAV form, the aircraft will be able to lift external loads of 6,000 pounds, which is more than 1,000 pounds greater than the aircraft's empty weight. It's partnering with Lockheed Martin on the project.

Aviation Hiring Rebounding

It may be a good time to refresh that resume as a report released at Heli-Expo in Orlando on Sunday suggests most aviation companies will be hiring in the coming year. The report, by Fort Worth-based JSfirm LLC, is based on a survey of 325 companies of all sizes. "We are certainly encouraged by the fact that nearly 90 percent of companies surveyed expect to hire in 2011," said JSfirm's managing partner Sam Scanlon.
