

The pictures below show wiring, fuel lines, etc. and the floor boards and side panels that will protect/hide the wiring, fuel lines, etc.



Yep, install panel, install fuel pump, check over the engine (with help from that ramp-ful of friendly expertise), start the engine, systems checkout, first flight... oh yeah, install windshield and take care of lots of details in between those big to do's.
